Giambattista Bodoni

Cunning, Elegant, Organic



First designed by Giambattista Bodoni in 1798 and is generally considered a “transitional” font type. Bodoni was an Italian engraver, type designer, typographer, printer, publisher. His typefaces steered away from the complexity of old style letters

and made them much more simple. The font was widely accepted by printers and can be seen in a broad of variety of publications and uses since the late 1700’s. In advertising Bodoni has been used in many logos because of its elegant style, including Vogue, Elizabeth Arden, Guerlain, Giorgio Armani and also the classic “CK” for Calvin Klein. In magazine publications such icons as Harper’s Bazaar.

It is versatile- it comes in many different weights and can be used for captions or display type because of its weight contrast among strokes. It’s form is not only elegant but it’s thick and thins make it cunning as well and can always be distinguished by its elegant shape, hairline serifs, and heavy down strokes. If I were to personify the font, Bodoni makes me think of this classy burlesque 1920’s flapper woman dressed in all black, but carries a revolver in her bra.

Look at nature. Look at flowers. We never walk into a garden and say, “oh wouldn’t that flower be so much prettier if it were taller? Or maybe red instead of pink?” Because nature was created perfect just as it is. For example, the egg has a perfect form even though it comes out of a butt. You see, Giambattista designed the font Bodoni to be so cunningly elegant that it just as organic to fit into the natural world around us.

It is ‘beautiful’ because it is just right. Find something beautiful in this world and admire it, and in that moment realize that it was created by human beings just like you, no more human, no less. We are all philocalists.

The lower case “c” has serif which almost resembles that of a leaf.
